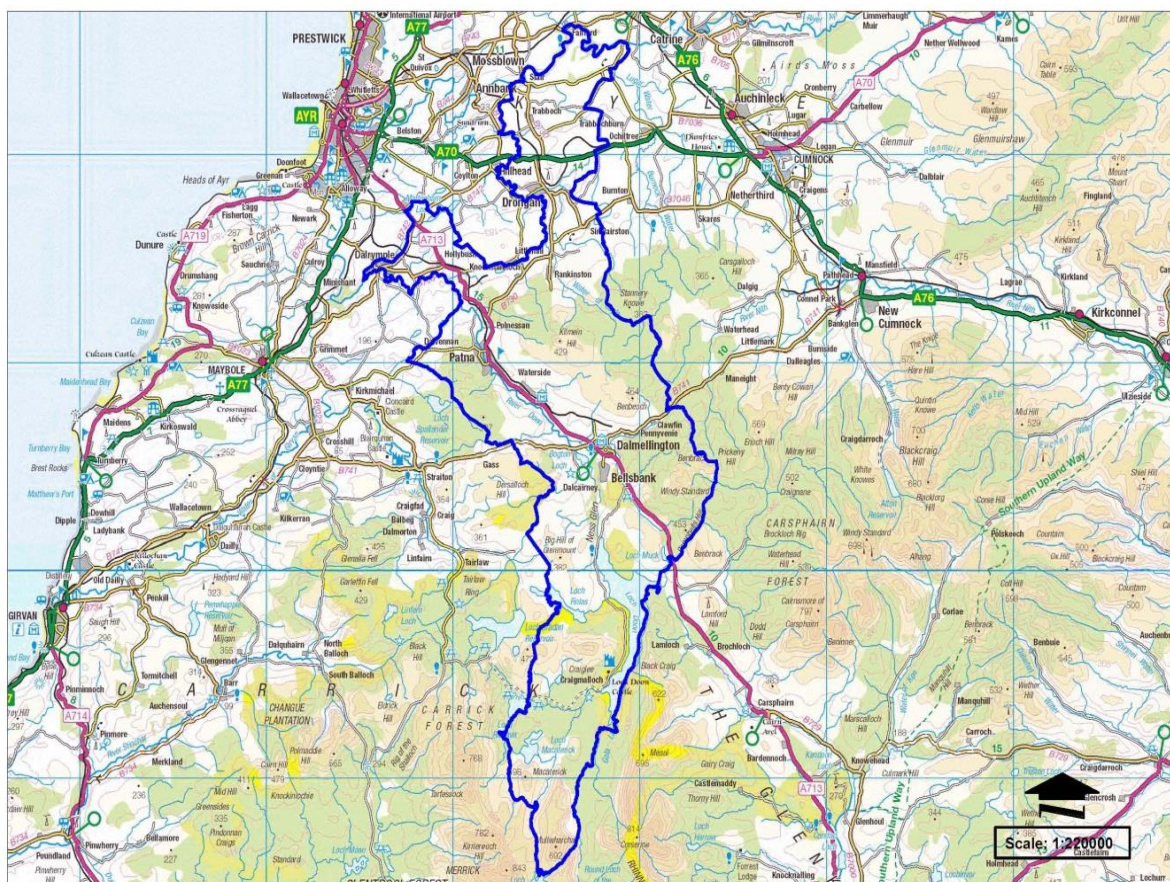


## Area Profile – Ward 9: Doon Valley

## Area Profile – Ward 9: Doon Valley

### POPULATION

Ward 9 has a population of 11,704, making up 10% of the population of East Ayrshire.

In Ward 9, 17% of the population are aged under 16 years, the same as East Ayrshire. Persons aged 65 and over make up 21% of the Ward 9 population, slightly higher than for East Ayrshire.

### HOUSEHOLDS AND DWELLINGS

The 2018 estimate of the number of dwellings in Ward 9 is 5,475. The proportion of these dwellings receiving a single adult Council Tax discount is 37%. For East Ayrshire, this figure is 38%.

In Ward 9, 4% of dwellings are vacant, higher than for East Ayrshire.

In Ward 9, the largest proportion of properties is in Council Tax Band A (65%) and the ward reports a smaller proportion of Band F, G and H (4%) properties compared to East Ayrshire as a whole (8%).

Ward 9 has a higher percentage of terraced housing (34.6%) and semi-detached properties (31.4%) than East Ayrshire as a whole (26.3% and 28.7% respectively).

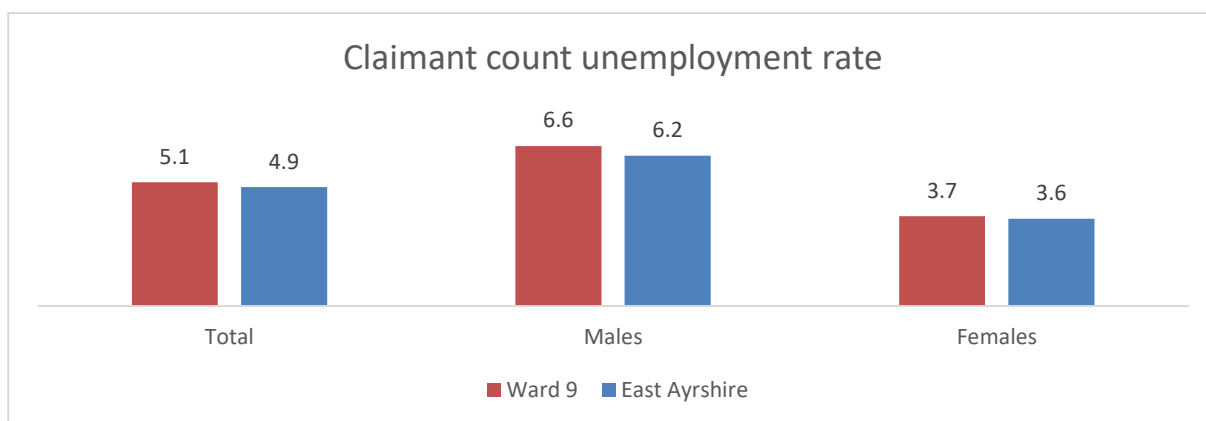

### ECONOMY AND SKILLS

#### Labour Market

Claimant count data provides an indication of the relative nature of the labour market adjustment across local authority areas. In East Ayrshire, claimant count unemployment (16-64) was 4.9% in January 2020, which was higher than the Scottish rate of 3.2%.

In Ward 9, claimant count unemployment was 5.1% at January 2020, which is higher than the East Ayrshire rate. In addition, Ward 9 and East Ayrshire as a whole, rates of unemployment are higher for males than for females.

#### Education and Learning

Lifelong learning is a key theme which underpins identified actions and shapes, informs and drives the learning agenda in East Ayrshire. Raising the educational attainment and achievement of our young people is essential to preparing them for the world of work and supporting them into adulthood. In recent years, we have seen improved performance in relation to pupil attainment in our secondary schools and the percentage of our young people who have secured positive and sustained destinations on leaving school is higher than the national average.

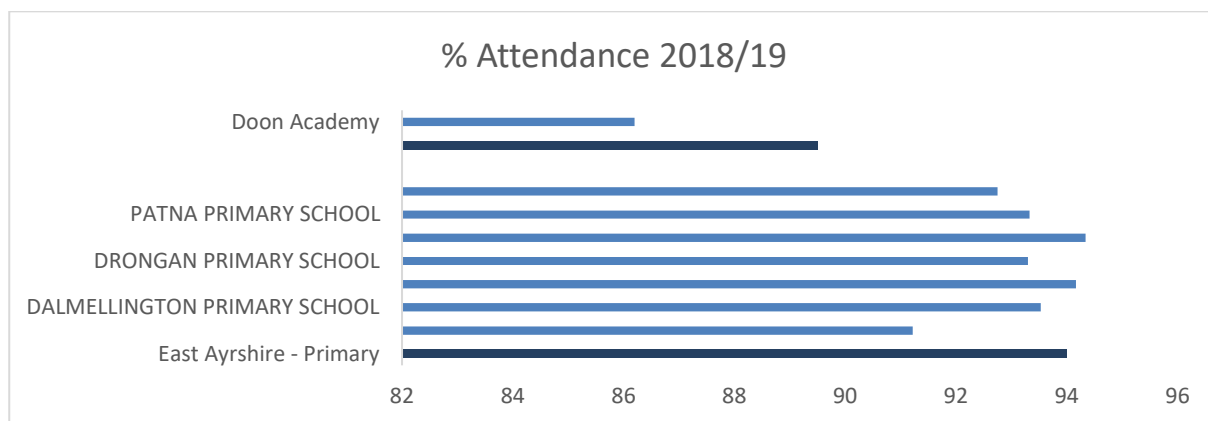
To maximise the potential of our young people and the wider workforce to deliver the capability that employers and the economy need, work is being taken forward to build stronger links between school, training, college, university and work. Investment in the Further Education sector locally and the creation of the new Ayrshire College campus at Hill Street in Kilmarnock will ensure that residents continue to prepare for job opportunities and working closely with local businesses will ensure that learning, skills and qualifications are aligned to current and future business need.

#### School Attendance

In 2018/19, there were 804 children attending East Ayrshire primary schools and 265 young people attending the East Ayrshire secondary school in Ward 9.

Primary school attendance within Ward 9 ranged from a low of 91.2% to a high of 94.3%. This compares with an East Ayrshire primary school attendance rate of 94.0%.

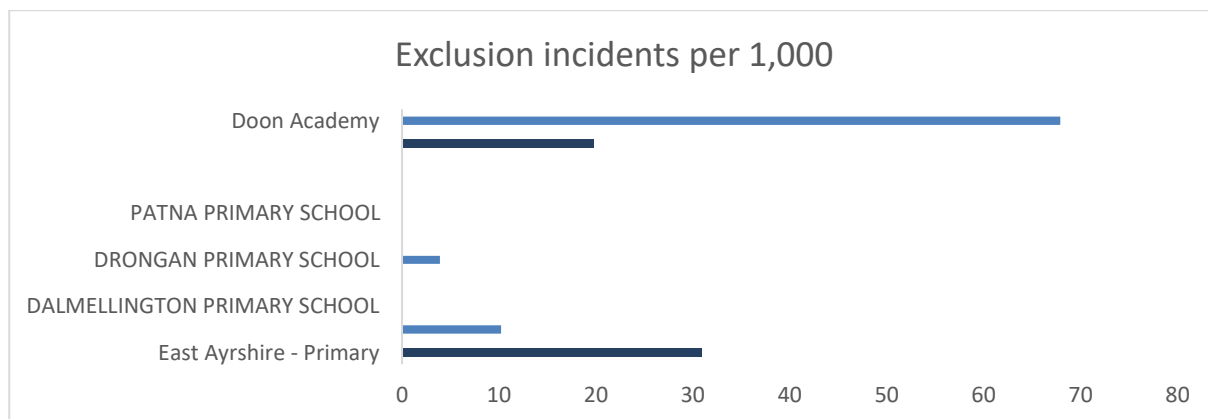

### Exclusion incidents

In 2018/19 only two East Ayrshire primary schools in Ward 9 had exclusions, and their rates were 3.9 and to 10.2 per 1,000, compared with the East Ayrshire rate of 30.9.

In 2018/19 rate of exclusion incidents in the secondary school in Ward 9 was 67.9 per 1,000, compared with the East Ayrshire rate of 19.8.

### Deprivation

In Ward 9 there is a low of 19.6% of P4-P7 pupils in receipt of free school meals while there is a high of 54.1%. The East Ayrshire average is 22.3%. For secondary schools, the respective figures for Ward 9 and East Ayrshire are 35.0% and 19.1%.

With regards to footwear and clothing grants there is a low of 27.7% pupils entitled and a high of 67.6%. The East Ayrshire average is 29.0%. For secondary schools, the respective figures for Ward 8 and East Ayrshire are 40.1% and 25.8%.

### SAFER COMMUNITIES

Between 2017/18 and 2018/19, the total crime rate for East Ayrshire increased by 1.2% from 419 crimes per 10,000 population in 2017/18 to 424 crimes per 10,000 population in 2018/19. Over the same period, there has been a 2.9% increase in the rate of crimes of dishonesty and a 14% decrease in the rate of sexual offences.

The overall crime rate is higher in Ward 9 than East Ayrshire as a whole, although the rates for robbery, serious assault and housebreaking are all lower.

### Fire Related Incidents

Fire prevention is a key issue currently being addressed in East Ayrshire.

In 2018/19, there were 145 fires in total and 120 deliberate fires responded to by Scottish Fire and Rescue in Ward 9.

The rate of deliberate fires in Ward 9 is more than double the average for East Ayrshire.

### WELLBEING

Opportunities continue to be provided for residents to improve their overall wellbeing, lead an active, healthy life and make positive lifestyle choices.

It is recognised that there are significant challenges in respect of the wellbeing of local communities, which will be tackled through the integrated health and social care arrangements. Over the coming years, the integration arrangements implemented in East Ayrshire will bring significant change to the way in which health and care services are delivered, including an important and developing role for the Third Sector in the provision of services and the attainment of health and wellbeing outcomes.

In Ward 9, 22% of mothers smoke at their ante-natal booking, which is above East Ayrshire as a whole. 25% are former smokers. The percentage of healthy birth weights is below the East Ayrshire figure.

With regard to children's health in Ward 9, the percentage of children in P1 with no obvious dental decay is 63%, which is above the East Ayrshire figure. When looking at P7 dental health this falls to 45% with no obvious dental decay, which is below the East Ayrshire figure. The percentage of P1 pupils in ward with a healthy weight is higher than the East Ayrshire figure.

### Health Inequalities

Despite overall improvements in health, individuals living in our most deprived communities experience much poorer health, wellbeing and life chances than those living in our least deprived areas.

The integration of health and social care will be a further opportunity to address the deep seated inequalities in East Ayrshire by focusing social care and wellbeing in the regeneration of our communities.

Six data zones within Ward 9 are within the most deprived 0-15% areas with regards to health. This is 35% of the ward's data zones. The respective figure for East Ayrshire is 24%.

### **Poverty and Deprivation**

East Ayrshire as a whole has higher levels of poverty than the Scottish average. In addition, there are sharp contrasts in the prosperity of communities across East Ayrshire, with some experiencing significant disadvantage while others are relatively affluent. In the north of the Authority, high levels of deprivation co-exist with the relatively wealthy commuting population.

### **Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation 2020**

There are 17 Data Zones in Ward 9, which is 10% of the East Ayrshire total (163 Data Zones). There are:

- 7 in the 0-20% most deprived; and
- 2 in the 0-5% most deprived.
